

Dr Stacie SALSBURY, PhD, RN is Associate Professor, Palmer Center for Chiropractic Research, Palmer College of Chiropractic, Davenport, Iowa, USA. Dr. Salsbury completed her PhD in Gerontological Nursing at The University of Iowa, but first knew she was interested in healthcare for older adults when she visited her Aunt Margaret in a nursing home when she was 5 years old. Stacie is a member of the Research Committee of the World Federation of Chiropractic, the WFC Global Patient Safety Initiative (WFC-GPSI), and the editorial boards of several peer-reviewed journals. Her introduction to healthy ageing and chiropractic care came when she served as project manager and investigator on the Collaborative Care for Older Adults with Low Back Pain (COCOA) Study. Currently, Dr. Salsbury is a co-investigator, qualitative methodologist, and implementation scientist on 2 research grants funded by the National Institutes of Health, National Center for Complementary and Integrative Health (NCCIH) including the Implementation of the American College of Physicians Guideline for Low Back Pain (IMPACT-LBP) and Veterans Response to Dosage in Chiropractic Therapy (VERDICT) pragmatic clinical trials. As part of VERDICT, Stacie contributes to the Pain Management Collaboratory (PMC) Older Adults Discussion Group where she is part of a multidisciplinary team evaluating the use of the Geriatric 5Ms in pain-related research. Her collaborative research also explores the 4Ms of Age-Friendly Research in chiropractic teaching settings.
