He champions long-standing goals of Hong Kong's chiropractic community, notably integrating care into public health systems and securing rights for practitioners to issue sick leave certificates. These initiatives aim to address healthcare gaps while honoring the legacy of pioneers who established the profession over 60 years ago.

His advocacy focuses on practical solutions to enhance chiropractic care's accessibility, safety, and alignment with community needs.
