Dr. Adjei-Kwayisi currently serves as a member of the Disability and Rehabilitation Committee of the World Federation of Chiropractic (WFC). Her expertise highlights the crucial role chiropractors play in enhancing rehabilitative care in low- and middle-income countries, aligning with the goals of the World Health Organization's (WHO) World Rehabilitation Alliance.
